HRAWI to explore new avenues for hotel & restaurant industry in maiden international Regional Convention

Underscoring the Hotel and Restaurant Association of Western India's (HRAWI) maiden Regional Convention to be held outside of the country, the 3-day event to be held from June 27-30, 2018 in Sri Lanka aims to be driven as a cultural exchange programme between the two countries.

Sri Lanka has been a venue for reputed international conferences, regional meetings, business gatherings, and sports events for the past several years."

Focusing on the convention, it will see the presence of key policymakers, international govt. representatives, investors, and industry stalwarts. From India, 200 people will be visiting the convention that will be joined by Sri Lankan guests at the Convention.

Mentioning that it would not be similar to the other standard conventions, Dinesh Advani, Convention Chairman and past President, HRAWI said that the second day would begin with a city tour paired with a lunch at local restaurant followed by traditional performance and rendition of both the national anthems in the evening at Hilton Grand Ball Room. The third day will be dedicated to business and networking with four different sessions on various aspects of hotel operations, food and travel bloggers, hotel interior trends and emerging restaurant trends in Sri Lankan Cuisine.
