Budget 2023 sees positive reactions from the hospitality industry

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman's Budget announcements for the tourism sector are designed to strengthen the hospitality industry, stated industry stalwarts, although they also highlighted that no direct support was mentioned in the budget statement. Industry associations expressed that the budget statement could have covered more direct support measures for the tourism and hospitality industry. However, the budget has rightly proposed tourism as a transformative engine for job creation which needs to be developed on a mission mode via PPP basis, along with focus

on 50 tourism destinations and infrastructure. As the budget was coming on the back of a recovery from the pandemic, this was an opportunity to strengthen the tourism travel and hospitality industry of India by aiding it to reclaim its global inbound tourism share which would have boosted employment pan India, the experts said.
