Madhya Pradesh and France sign cultural MoU to deepen global tourism links

In a major step towards international cultural collaboration, Madhya Pradesh has signed a landmark Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the French Government and Alliance Française de Bhopal, setting the stage for deeper Indo-French ties in tourism, heritage, and education.

- French language and culture training programs for state tourism personnel and guides.

• Academic and cultural exchange programs spotlighting Madhya Pradesh's artists and artisans on the global stage.

This MoU is expected to significantly boost Madhya Pradesh's international visibility, attract more foreign tourists, and cement the state's position as a leading cultural tourism destination in India.
