Goa's 2025-26 tourism season begins with chartered flight arriving from Kazakhstan

Goa officially ushered in its 2025–26 charter tourism season with the arrival of the first international charter flight at Dabolim Airport. Operated by SCAT Airlines, the flight from Almaty, Kazakhstan landed at 5:30 a.m., marking the start of what is expected to be a vibrant inbound travel season for the coastal state.

Guests were greeted with garlands, floral welcomes, a brass band performance, and a cake-cutting ceremony to mark the commencement of the new charter season.

The arrival of the first charter flight signals the beginning of a promising season ahead, with several international charters from other destinations expected to land in Goa in the coming weeks — reaffirming the state's standing as one of India's most sought-after beach and leisure destinations.
